

## **Stewardship and Finance**


## Respectfully Submitted by Marcia Murphy, Vestry Liaison to Finance & Stewardship

The Finance Committee met regularly in 2019 keeping track of necessary financial procedural changes, updates and the financial state of ECA. This information was reported back to the Vestry.

The 2020 stewardship campaign – "Shining Our Light" has been very successful – thanks to the help of Ron Sedgley, Penny Capawana and Fr. Paul, with guidance from Sandi Harden.

The campaign started with a letter from Fr. Paul to Parish members. Suzie Hart shared her reflections on stewardship. Personal testimonials were shared by myself, Cheryl and Ron Farr, Lindsay and James Stinchcomb, and Bliss and Foster Peterson. These were inserted in each Sunday's bulletin from October 6<sup>th</sup> to October 27<sup>th</sup> and posted on the church website.

Bliss also shared with the congregation the benefits of having your pledge sent directly from your bank to ECA. At last update we have received 89 pledges with 60% increasing their giving. Total to date (as of December) - \$210, 508.

We were fortunate to have baptisms for three children and two adults this year and 276 blankets and 8 prayer shawls were blessed. The Altar guild made several new linens (purificators, corporals and towels). Also, a Christmas inventory was completed to place in the Altar guild customary and a Lenten and Easter inventory is being prepared. New music was purchased and was used for Advent and Christmas services and the annual Advent Wreath workshop was held on Nov. 30th.

**Papa's Pantry:** A huge donation of food was given to Papa's Pantry thanks to the generosity of the parishioners and the matching contributions of Ameris Bank.

**Emmaus House:** A food supply for the Grandparents Dinner is set up and gifts have been purchased for the Children's Christmas party.

Thanksgiving Dinners: Five families received fully cooked Thanksgiving dinners on Nov. 27th.

**Angel Tree:** four families have been chosen and the Angel Tree will be put in the Narthex during the first week of December.

### **Accomplishments:**

- Reach Committee donated a total of \$10,500 in designated contributions through either check or goods to fifteen (15) charities in the Atlanta area. In additions, many families and military were helped as well.

- Reach Committee provided Coffee Hour for one Sunday with plans to do more in the coming year.
- Annual Yard Sale raised over \$4000 in funds for the Reach Budget.

Our year started with a working Vestry retreat weekend in Ellijay January 25<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup>. These retreats are vital in the life of the church and are 3 full days of action. Once we returned, we jumped right in with the first of **many** receptions held for many different occasions. From the beginning (birthdays) to the end (Celebrations of life.) and any of several other reasons!

We held a large reception when Bishop Wright joined us on 2-17.

Some of the meetings that are held consistently with the cooperation / full support of with Parish Life are the ECW and men's groups. ECW enjoyed things such as (but not limited to) The British Tea, a trip to the Atlanta History Center, a trip to the Booth Western Museum and a tour and lunch at the Tate House. During their May meeting the ECW voted, and recommended to the Vestry, a donation of \$2,500 from proceeds received from the 2019 ladies Tea, to be used towards the reduction of our parish mortgage debt. The ECA Men's Group got together during the year also for events such as, a bowling night, a trip to an Atlanta Braves game (Braves won!), our annual fishing trip and hosted (with help form ECW) a community fish fry. We all also helped to support our REACH yard sale

The men's group is very proud of the formation of an every other Saturday morning men's bible discussion/reflection get together.

Parish life also offers the monthly dominos game night and other, sometimes spontaneous events, such as fire-pits.

All events are offered not only to out parish, but to family, friends and the community.

Parish life is just that – infusing time and talent into the life of the church from within, to OUR community.

## During November 2019:

- Men's Group met for the ongoing bible discussion. (Postponed over Thanksgiving) The group is working on ideas that will allow others to join. The 7:30 time seems to be a hesitant to some, so the group is considering a change of time to see if that helps.
- A great time was had on November 2<sup>nd</sup> during the Taste & Brews Country Festival. A group of church members and friends met to enjoy the festival and music. After the music program everyone was invited to tailgate as we cooked lunch and fellowshipped into the late afternoon.
- On 11-16 the ECW toured Oakwood Cemetery followed by midafternoon meal at 6 feet under. (A restaurant!)
- ECW meeting was held on 12-24.

- Request from ECW to spend out of designated funds up to \$857 to subsidize the ECW retreat scheduled for January 17<sup>th</sup> to 19th. This total will include up to \$200 for up to 4 \$50 scholarships if needed.
- A group got together for our monthly night of playing dominoes.
- Geoff Myers changed the electronic sign for events as needed and hopes to train out new communication director on how to do the same.
- Gamblers Anonymous is scheduled each Saturday at 9AM in the Activities Building

Summary: The Buildings & Grounds committee has been active all year. Many people have offered their time and talent to maintain & beautify our church grounds. Without the generosity of our parishioners with their time, treasure and talent none of this would be possible.

- Electronic sign and new ECA sign top were installed.
- New A/C unit installed in the activities building.
- 55" flat screen TV installed in the activities building.
- A metal recycling run was made \$87.00 collected for REACH.
- Planting a Japanese Maple given by Dana Godfrey on the side of the Sanctuary.
- Several workdays to clean, weed, plant, trim, mulch, pine straw, work at the pond and generally tidy our campus to include replacing some boards and hand railing on the ramp of the activities building, replacing solar lamps on the walkway, fixed the drainage area outside of the swift building, heater covers cleaned and painted in the Sacristy and in the restrooms, installed a new garage door at the back of the Activities Building

I can say without a doubt, we live out our mission statement pretty darn well. We have much to be thankful for at Annunciation and the phrase "Grace upon grace" rings so true for us and our ministry. I am in my 12<sup>th</sup> year as rector and it is the longest time ECA has had a priest serving in this parish.
